Dear Parents/Carers

As we approach our final week together I would like to share our plans for how we will say goodbye.

Next Friday, 28 May all Year 11 students will spend time with their Tutors at the start of period 4. They will have a chance to say goodbye, have some photos with each other and there will be a leavers video to watch, in which Mrs Oakley and I will have our chance to say farewell.

Shirt signing was due to take place at the 'Wildern Fest', however after listening to students it was clear that they wanted to do this before leaving and so after tutor time they will get the opportunity to meet all together within their Year 11 bubble and sign shirts.
