Re: Year 7 - Ironbridge Trip to Shropshire - Friday 1 - Sunday 3 July 2022

The History Department is organising a residential trip for Year 7 students to visit Ironbridge. Students will gain a detailed knowledge of the Victorians through first hand experiences including visits to the famous Ironbridge, Museum of Iron, Ingenuity Museum, Blists Hill Victorian Village and Coalport China Museum for workshops. We will also visit Cadbury World on the outbound journey.

The accommodation for the visit will be the Youth Hostel Coalport in Ironbridge, Shropshire. The overall cost of the trip is £220.00. This includes transport, accommodation, all meals and entrances. Unfortunately, the school budget is unable to fund trips and they are only possible if all parents are willing to contribute. Trips will have to be cancelled if this does not happen. Payments can be made in full or split into four with a non-refundable payments with a deposit of £55.00 payable by 31 January 2022, then a further three instalments of £55.00 by 28 February, 31 March and 30 April 2022.

You will be asked to provide your emergency contact details and any relevant medical information. If a deposit, or full payment, is required this will also need to be paid at the time. There are only 40 places available for this trip. In the event of oversubscription we will endeavour to take into consideration any students who may have missed out on trips previously due to oversubscription and will allocate any further places by drawing names out of a hat. In the event of a place not being allocated you will be informed and any monies received will be returned.

Teachers accompanying residential visits carry enormous responsibility for the students in their care. The Senior Leadership Team therefore reserve the right to refuse or withdraw a place to any student whose behaviour in school has been or becomes a problem.
