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| English | <p>Students will continue the 'content carousel' scheme of work in English, in which we cycle through core concepts relevant to all of the Literature texts and combine this with approaches to the Language questions.</p> <p>Parents can support their children with English revision by encouraging them to study 'little and often'. The best form of revision for English Language is completing past paper questions - these can be found on our English googlesite: https://sites.google.com/wildern.org/english/home</p> <p>English Literature revision can be more diverse and students should centre their revision on being confident with the characters/plot and themes of all their texts and how to apply these to an exam question. | Maths | <p>This half term year 11 will be working on exam preparation and will continue to do practice papers in lessons and for self study.</p> |
| Science | <p>This half term year 11 will focus on Physics Paper 2 revision, covering the following units:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - P5 Forces - P6 Waves - P7 Magnetism and electromagnetism <p>Students will complete physics exam papers for self study.</p> |
| Education for Life | <p>Year 11: Life after Wildern</p> <p>This bespoke unit explores how to deal with exam stress and how to look after your own mental health and wellbeing with the upcoming GCSE's. Throughout the unit, a variety of tips and techniques are shared with students to help equip them now and for their future life after Wildern.</p> |
| Core Pe | <p>All PE classes are starting a rotation of summer sports including Athletics, Tennis & Striking and Fielding games within their chosen pathway.</p> |
| Animal Care | <p>Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams, covering the key concepts for component 3. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Animal legislation ● Diseases ● Housing and looking after animals ● Animals in education, leisure and conservation |

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| Art | Art and Photography students complete their Externally Set Assignment (NEA) weighted at 40% of their final GCSE grade. Students work through the 4 Assessment Objectives over a term prior to sitting their year 11 final ten hour exam. |
| AQA award | Revision Skills & Techniques. Planning for upcoming exams. |
| Business Studies | Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams. |
| Computer Science | Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams |
| Dance | Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams |
| Design Technology | Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exam. |
| Drama | Students will be recalling information for their exam written paper. Looking at their play text "Blood Brothers" and writing a live theatre review on "the papers birds" award winning play "In A Thousand Pieces". |
| Food & Nutrition | Students will be completing in class revision in the final build up to their GCSE exam. This will include trialling various active revision techniques which can be used at school and at home. |
| Geography | Students will be completing their in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams. |
| Hospitality & Catering | Students will be completing in class revision in the final build up to their GCSE exam. This will include trialling various active revision techniques which can be used at school and at home. |
| History | In class revision, planning and completion of exam questions for Paper 1 (America: Expansion and Consolidation/Conflict and Tension). They will then use the seminar timetable to continue preparation for Paper 1. Please note Friday 30th May as our half term revision day which we strongly encourage all students to attend. This will focus on Paper 2 (Britain: Health and the People and Norman England 1066-1100). |
| IT | Students will be doing an in-class revision program in the final build up to their GCSE exams |
| Media | Students will be revising the theoretical framework and close study products. |
| MFL (French, German or Spanish) | Students will complete their final speaking exam in the first 5 days of the half term, which counts for 25% of their final grade. They will then be continuing to practise exam skills and recap key language ready for the exams. |
| Music | Students will complete programme notes for their composition NEA. They will also complete revision tasks in preparation for their listening exam. |

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| RE | Students will be revising key content from all of their topics in preparation for the final exams. |
| Examination PE | Both Sports Studies and GCSE PE students will be focusing on in class revision to prepare them for the upcoming written examinations. |
| Photography | Art and Photography students complete their Externally Set Assignment (NEA) weighted at 40% of their final GCSE grade. Students work through the 4 Assessment Objectives over a term prior to sitting their year 11 final ten hour exam. |
| Psychology | Preparing for the GCSE exams Paper 1 (50%) and Paper 2 (50%) taking place this half-term. |
