



Wildern School Visits Prospectus 2019 - 2021



Wildern School has always offered a fantastic range of domestic residential and international residential visits. Some of our trips are extremely well-established and have been offered for many years; students and former students will talk glowingly about their school visits to Austria, Belgium, the USA, and Germany. Some have an entirely sporting focus (for example, our skiing trips and water sports trips). Others have had a particular curriculum focus (for example, our trips run by the History or Geography departments). Others have had a cultural focus (for example our exchange trips to Germany and Portugal). This prospectus indicates our current plans so that parents can see what trips are being offered, or are likely to be offered in the future. We cannot guarantee that every trip will run, nor can we guarantee that every child who wishes to go will secure a place. It may also be possible for a trip to be offered that is not in the prospectus. This sometimes happens when a new member of staff joins the school and is keen to offer a new experience. However, it is hoped this booklet will give a helpful guide and help parents plan accordingly.

Exchange Trips

Germany

The German exchange trip is an annual twinning event with our partner school in Kornwestheim, Germany. The exchange trip is open to students in Years 8-10 who learn German. We spend nine days in Germany at the end of the Spring term. Our German guests visit us for a similar length of time at the beginning of July.

The German exchange offers a uniquely international experience. Wildern students have the opportunity to develop their foreign language skills in an authentic context. They mix with and develop friendships with Germans of a similar age. They visit places of historic and international renown such as Heidelberg, the Black Forest and Lake Constance.

Over the last 40 years, the German exchange has been a life-changing experience for Wildern students. Many have chosen to study German and use it in their future profession. Friendships have even developed between the respective families of exchange partners.

Portugal

There are very limited places on this exchange visit. Wildern School has developed a link with a school in Silves, Portugal and has set up an exchange programme. Silves School in Portugal holds their own Tech Fest event each year and we send students who host families to Portugal in return. The students host a Portuguese student in July for 5 days including a day excursion during the school week and activities with the other hosting students. All students attend The Wildern Teach Fest event with their hostees and time is spent as British School children. In March the following year, we take the 6 students to Portugal so they can explore the Portuguese culture and live as Portuguese students.

We offer an annual skiing trip for students in Years 8, 9 and 10. This will give students the opportunity to attend a skiing tour without affecting Year 11 examination revision. Securing a Place on a Trip and Oversubscription Criteria

Each trip will have a published closing date to return reply slips and initial deposit. The School will not adopt a first-come-first-served basis for allocating places on trips. However, students applying by the closing date will be offered places before any student applying after the closing date. Students will not be able to secure a place on any trip if their parents owe the school money for other trips or activities. Where a trip is oversubscribed, the trip organiser will investigate whether it is possible to take additional students. Where this is not possible, students will be allocated on the following basis:

- 1. Priority will be given to students who have a particular educational need. For example, Year 10 students choosing GCSE History would have priority for a place on the American West trip.
- 2. Priority will be given to students who have been on the fewest previous trips or who do not have confirmed places on planned international residential visits organised by the School.
- 3. Names will be drawn randomly out of a hat by the trip leader. If multiple birth students have applied, all or no siblings will be offered a place.
- 4. A waiting list will be compiled and kept by the trip leader in accordance with points 1 to 3. Students applying after the published return deadline will join the waiting list in the order in which they have returned their reply slip.

The list of students on the trip will be circulated to the Director of Progress and Achievement. In consultation with SLT, the DOPA may remove a student from a trip where it is decided that recent behaviour gives rise to concerns about the impact the student might have on the safety, well-being or enjoyment of other students on the trip or where behaviour on any previous visit resulted in a sanction upon return to school. Parents will be informed of whether their child has secured a place on the trip.

Visits Code of Conduct

- Remember to be polite and cooperative at all times, whether dealing with each other, members of staff or members of the public. You are representing your school.
- Listen carefully to all instructions and act on them.
- Punctuality is important. Always report at the time and place agreed with members of staff.
- Never go anywhere without clear permission from a member of staff. Always go in groups of at least three, never alone.
- Treat others and their property with respect. Ensure hotel rooms or accommodation is kept and left tidy.
- Report all incidents or breakages to a member of staff immediately.
- Quiet and lights out at the agreed time.
- Coaches are to be kept tidy, no litter or chewing gum.
- No smoking and no alcohol. These and any other prohibited item must not be purchased to be brought back e.g. fireworks, penknives or laser pens.

Failure to follow this code of conduct will result in sanctions being applied:

Minor incidents will be dealt with on the visit by the member of staff with responsibility for behaviour. Sanctions may be a verbal reprimand or loss of free time.

Serious incidents will be dealt with on the return to school and could result in a ban from further visits.

In the unlikely event of a student committing gross misconduct the student will be sent home from the visit early at the expense of the parent.
