<u>Sock Snowmen</u> are the perfect decoration to add anywhere in the house. You can customise your snowman to suit your preference / aesthetic. The are really easy to make and only require very little equipments:

- Socks
- Ribbon
 - Glue
 - Rice

Section 1: The Hat

- Grab a colored sock that you would like for the hat and cut off the toe end of the sock.
- Cirl the cutted end of the sock and glue it in place, leave it aside and let it dry

Section 2: The Snowman

- Grab a sock of the preferred colour of your snowman and fill the bottom of the sock with a little bit of rice, this will give it stability and wont fall over.
- Fill the remainder of the sock with stuffing of any kind, but leave a small gap at the top.
- Tie the top of the sock and cut off the access.
- Add the hat where the top of your snowman is, if you want it to be permanently on, glue the base of the hat to the snowman.

Section 3: The Body

• Tie a piece of ribbon or decorative material round the body to separate the head you can add a bow or knot into the ribbon to make it more realistic.

Section 4: Face

Glue on a pair of eyes or draw them onto the snowman, you can also add a nose.

Section 5: The Decoration

(This step is optional) Glue some buttons or other material onto the body of the snowman.

There are many other creative ways to make a snowman to personalise it to suit your preference such as adding glitter, stars to the hat or creating another creature such as a penguin or any other creature..
