During this evening we were able to share how we identify students with SEND, the support that we offer and suggestions for how you can help at home. The feedback for this event was overwhelmingly positive and we will be running similar events in the future.

Reading Progress

We continue to achieve great success with our Year 7 reading intervention programmes. Students who participated in the Reading Ambassadors programme have on average made double the expected progress. Students who have participated in the Rapid Reading intervention programme have made incredible progress achieving more than 4 times the expected progress. Well done to everyone involved!

Autism in School's Project

At Wildern School we are proud to have participated in the **Autism in Schools** project, a collaborative initiative funded by the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Integrated Care Board (NHS). This project is delivered in partnership with Hampshire County Council, BRAAIN (Be Ready ADHD ASD Information Network), and Autism Hampshire to enhance support for neurodiverse students.

As part of the project, we have gathered valuable feedback from various sources, including parent forums, a parent survey, pupil voice, our school's Baseline Questionnaire, and a Learning Walk. This feedback is helping us identify key priorities to further develop and improve the support we provide for autistic and neurodiverse students.

We are committed to creating an inclusive learning environment where every student can thrive, and we look forward to implementing positive changes based on these insights.

As parents you play a crucial role in shaping your child's understanding of neurodiversity. The neurodiversityweek.com website provides a useful starting point for discussions around what it means to be neurodiverse and why it is important to appreciate everyone's differences.
