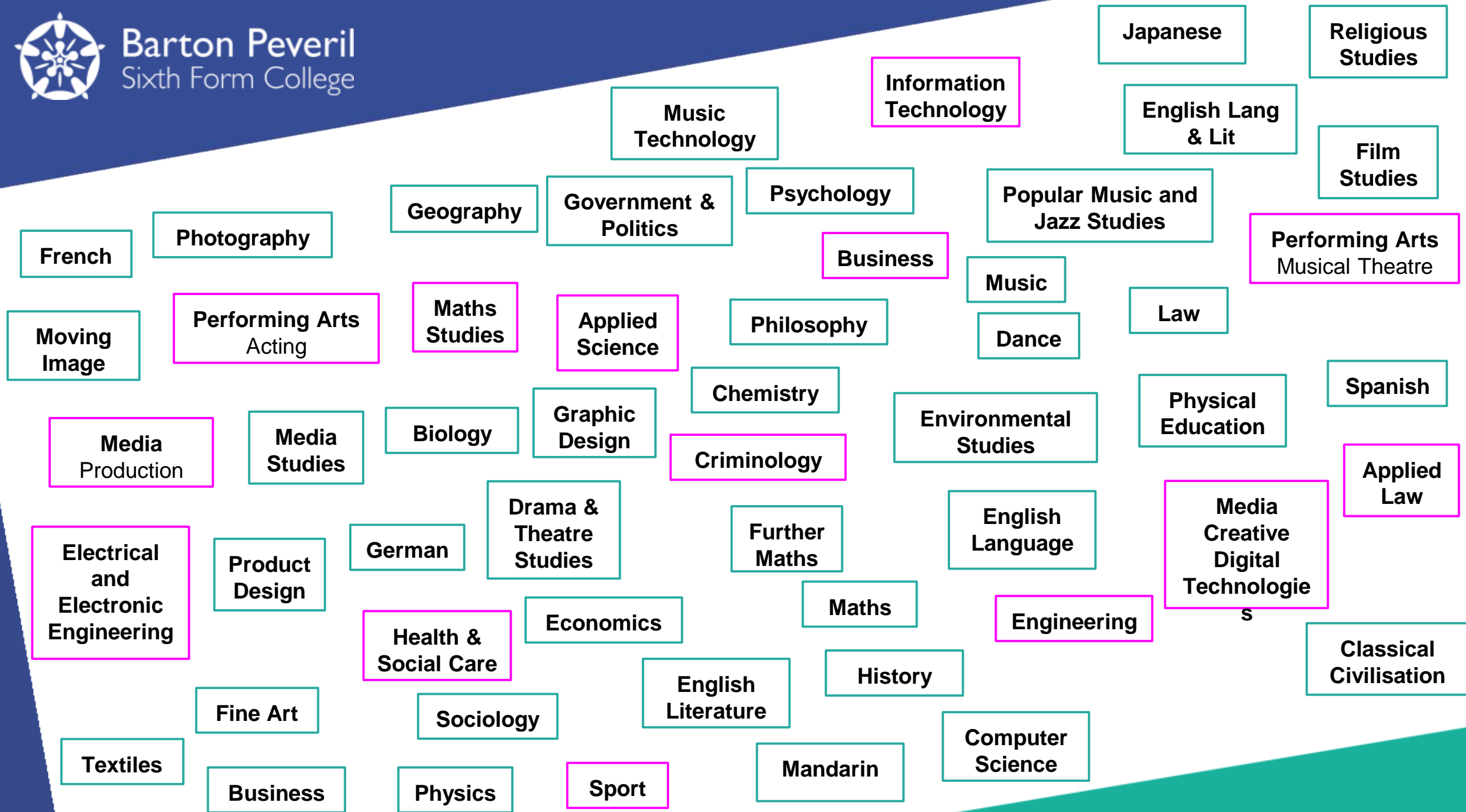

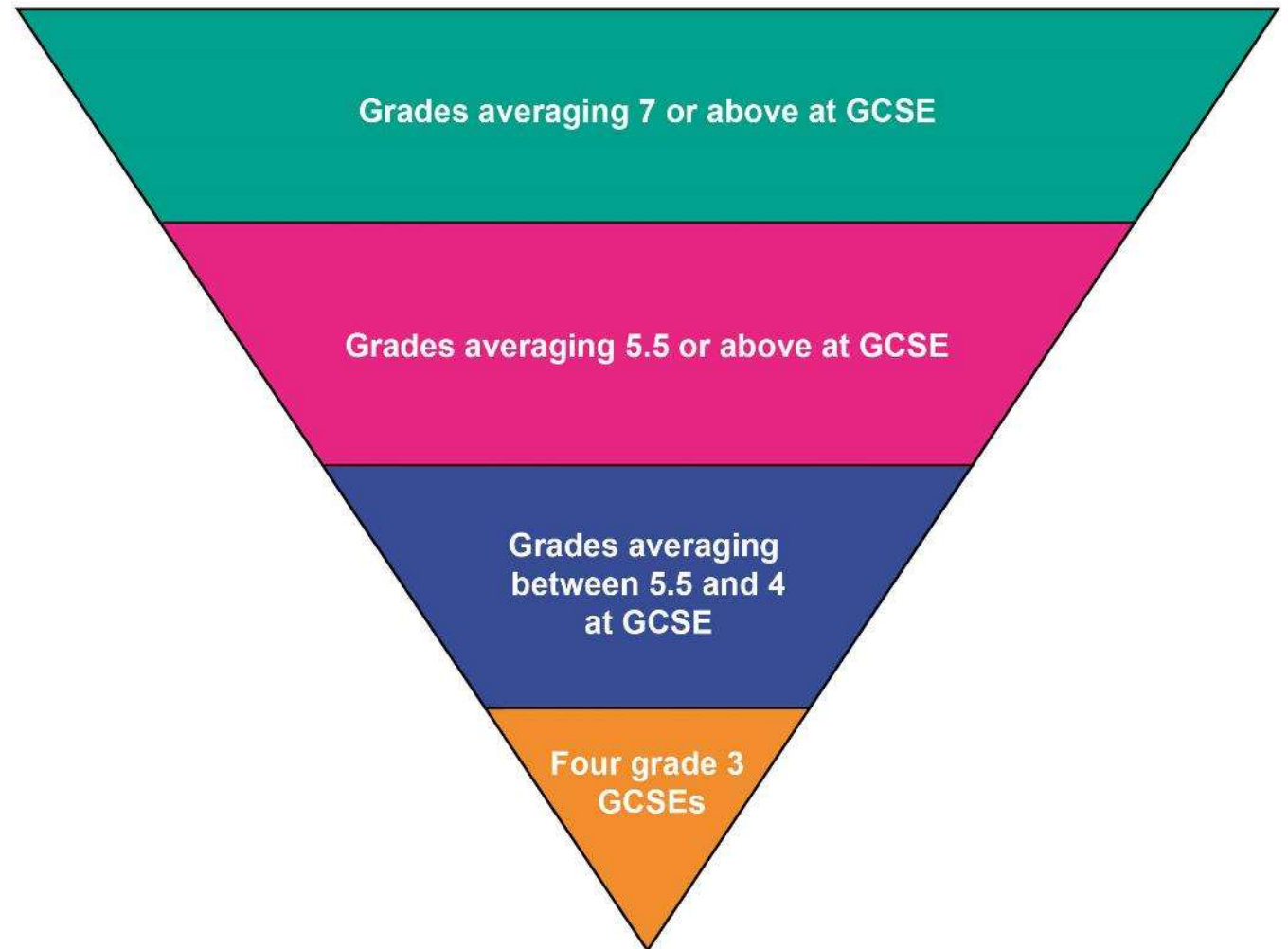
Some things to note about courses...

- A level is the traditional route to Uni.
- Data shows some A levels require better GCSE grades to do well: PE; Psychology; Economics; Languages; Computing; Law; Geog; Maths; Sciences
- 6-9 grade GCSE results are a good indication that you will do well taking A levels and a full choice is available.
- 4/5 grades make Cert and Diploma alternatives excellent options to consider
- A levels are not the only route to University in fact over 50% of successful applicants nationally last year were “non-A level”
- 30% of our students at college take a vocational course or a combined Vocational with A level
- Beware of imposing parental choices!



Entry requirements

- Set you up for success
- Ensure you are on the right programme of study
- Minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grade 4 and above
- The better you do at GCSE, the more options you have!





Your programme of study:

- You'll do the minimum of 3 A Levels or equivalent.
- There are numerous vocational options.
- You can study A Levels alongside certain vocational options.
- Tailored to you and your specific goals.

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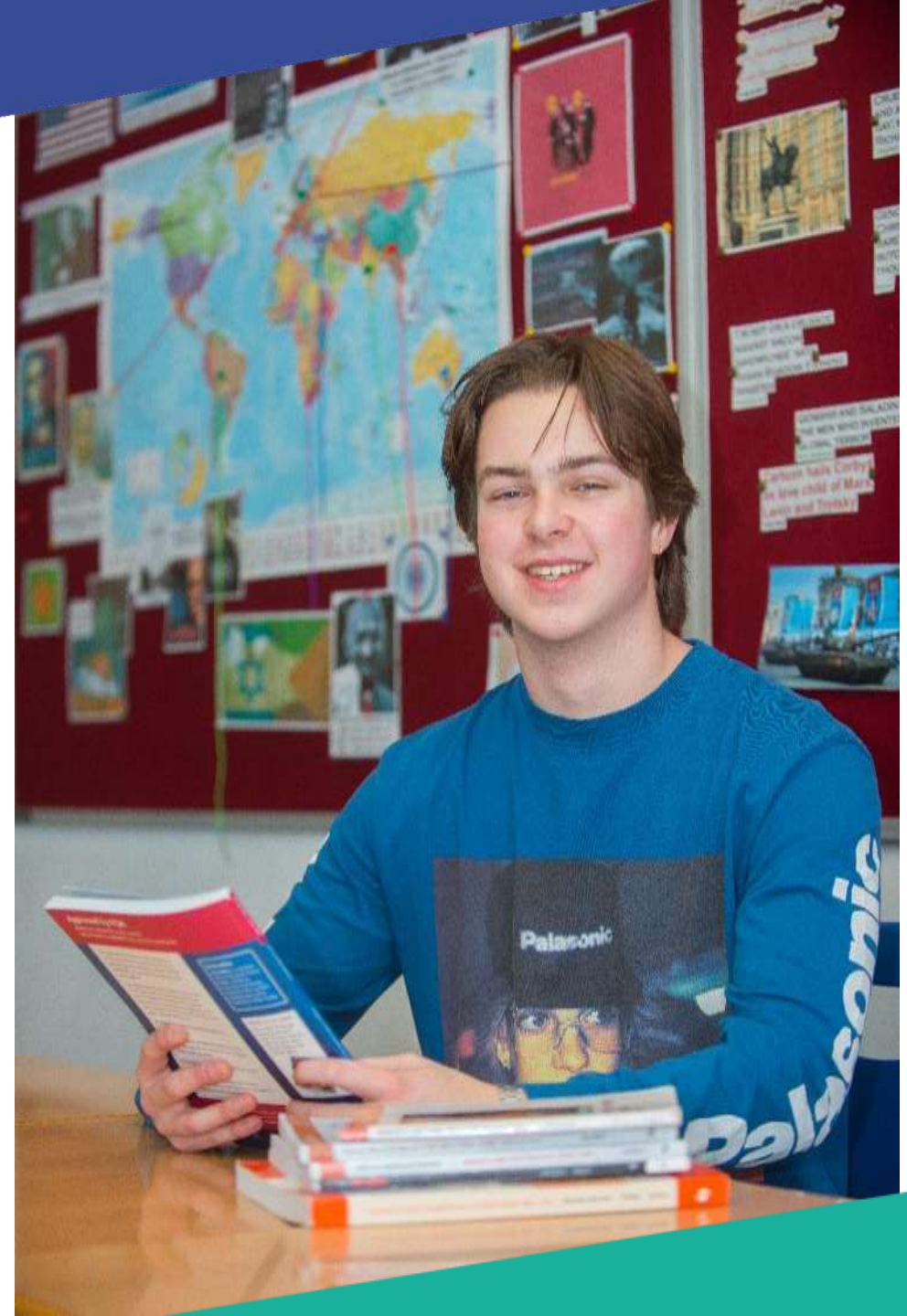
